Historical Note:

Mothers of World War II was a national organization founded in March 1942 to unite all mothers who had sons or daughters in the service of the United States military or its Allies. The organization aimed to bolster their children in service by supporting the local, state, and national war effort. They held annual district conventions where members would report on their charitable efforts, install officers, and coordinate statewide service initiatives. These conventions helped link national advocacy with local acts of care. The organization also published a monthly newspaper, War Mothers' Voice, which kept members informed and connected.

Urbana's Surrell's Unit no. 19 was formed in July 1943 and remained active until at least 1982. Mrs. Robert M. (Ruth) Neely was the first elected president. The Urbana unit supported troops with fund drives, sewing projects, letter writing and package campaigns, hospital visits to the wounded, and updating Champaign County's Honor Roll of men and women who served in the military. The Urbana unit was named after Leroy Surrell, Champaign County's first WWII casualty.

Scope and Content Note:

The Mothers of World War II records document the activities and experiences of mothers who supported soldiers during World War II and continued their involvement in veteran and community efforts after the war. The collection includes letters, photographs, certificates, programs, and other materials related to the organization's work and the personal experiences of its members. The Urbana unit kept annual records by scrapbooking their meetings and activities using newspaper clippings,

certificates, programs, photographs, and miscellaneous materials. There are also some annual summaries of their year's work, correspondence from other organizations, and copies of the national "War Mothers Voice."
