### **Historical Note:**

The Boneyard Creek is a major drainage outlet for Champaign, Urbana, and the University of Illinois. The creek begins in north Champaign and flows southeasterly into Campustown. It roughly parallels Green Street for a mile before it converges with the Saline Branch of the Vermilion River northeast of downtown Urbana. The creek is approximately 3.3 miles long.

Historically, the creek has had problems with flooding, poor water quality, and inadequate maintenance. In 1975, the Champaign County Bicentennial Commission selected the restoration of Boneyard Creek as its major Horizon '76 project resulting in the creation of the Boneyard Creek Commission and the 1978 Boneyard Creek Master Plan. Recently, several plans (1997, 2008) have focused on alleviating flooding, improving the creek's environment, creating detention basins, and renovating the surrounding parks and greenways.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

This collection contains materials related to the Boneyard Creek including materials from the Champaign County Bicentennial Commission and its adoption of the restoration of Boneyard Creek as its Horizon '76 project named 'Our Boneyard.' It also contains newspaper clippings files, blueprints and profiles of the Boneyard, as well as government documents containing evolving proposals and plans for the Boneyard Creek corridor.

### Arrangement:

The collection is arranged into two series, General Files and Government Documents. Within each series, the folders are arranged alphabetically.
