Historical Note:

The Friday Tea Club was a social club for women living on and around Race Street in Urbana, IL. The first meeting was held on March 2, 1923 at the home of Mrs. Kansas Ann Green of 501 South Race Street, and held every two weeks thereafter (changed later to monthly). Members took turns hosting mainly in their homes with another member acting as "assistant hostess." Club activities typically began in September with the annual chicken fry, held most often at Hessel Park, and ended in May with the annual luncheon, held at the Hi-Hat Tea Room on the University of Illinois campus and later at the Urbana Country Club.

This collection contains two notebooks of meeting minutes and a scrapbook with photographs, newspaper clippings, and ephemera.
